COURSE DESCRIPTION OF FIRST/SECOND-YEAR SPANISH

Participation Grade: You can earn up to ... points for consistent, active participation in daily activities. Participation includes coming prepared to class, volunteering to speak, paying attention to class activities, asking for help when you do not understand what is going on, speaking Spanish at all times, and maintaining a positive and supportive attitude towards your classmates. Effort, enthusiasm, and attention count, so even if your spoken Spanish is not as strong as you would like it to be, you can improve your participation grade if you work at it consistently. Please see the Class Participation rubric—and others in ICON. (You may wish to show and explain the Class Participation Rubric in the Recursos para TAs in ICON.)

Other information about this class

- * The purpose of this class is to make progress in your Spanish learning. You can maximize your learning by participating enthusiastically into all class activities and by supporting your classmates in doing the same. Respect each other. This means listening while others are talking, being supportive of each other, and never making fun of anyone else's efforts to speak Spanish.
- * The Course Overview lays out in detail the policies for this course attendance, academic honesty, make-ups, grading, etc. Read it carefully and consult it often. Students and instructors will be held to the policies given in it.
- * Attendance will be taken daily. See the Course Overview for the attendance policy for this course and how it affects make-up tests, quizzes, and other graded activities. If you have an anticipated absence (e.g., upcoming surgery, university-sponsored event, religious observance) you should talk to the GEP Director, Elizabeth Guzman, ahead of time so she can arrange for you to make up the work, except for quizzes. If you know you are going to be absent on a day when homework is due, you may turn in the homework as long as you do so ahead of time.
- * Arriving late to class. All quizzes are given at the beginning of the class period. Therefore, it is important that you arrive on time to class. You will not be given extra time for a quiz if you arrive late, nor will you be allowed to make up a quiz that you miss by not arriving on time. Two late arrivals of more than 5 minutes will count as one absence.
- * You will be held to high standards of academic honesty in this class. Work that you turn in for a grade (quizzes, tests, Writing Activities, culture project, etc.) must be entirely your own work, unless the activity specifically calls for collaboration. If you have questions about the expectations for a particularly activity, please ask for clarification. See the Course Overview for the on getting help from others on course assignments. - * Due to the nature of the class and the size of the room, please do not bring food or drink into the classroom. Gum chewing and texting are NOT permitted
